#### **IDENTITY ASSURANCE**



# Working Committee Highlights & Resources

The <u>ATM Working Committee</u> published a <u>white paper</u> exploring Contactless Adoption at the ATM and has begun a new work product on the topic of fallback transactions at the ATM.

The <u>Communication & Education Working Committee</u> completed a LinkedIn Best Practices Playbook for Forum members to use to promote Forum resources on LinkedIn.

The <u>Debit Routing Working Committee</u> provided an overview of notable past deliverables during the Forum's virtual member meeting and discussed possible new projects on a range of topics including PINless Debit Routing 2.0, performance monitoring, consequential impacts to debit routing, and tokenization.

The Electric Vehicle (EV) Open Payments Working Committee recently began a project delving into Best Practices for Capturing and Displaying EV Charging Payment Methods. The EV Open Payments Working Committee is also working on a project on the topic of EV Fleet with the goal to inform the fleet to better understand fleet acceptance with various EV networks. The working committee co-chairs participated in a virtual panel on the evolving landscape of EV payments during the Forum's summer member meeting and also welcomed new co-chair Francesco Chevallard of Explicit Selection.

The Mobile & Touchless Payments Working Committee published a white paper examining how government-issued mobile IDs, which include mDLs, can be leveraged in the payments ecosystem, including examples of where digital identities and digital payment acceptance can potentially converge. The Mobile & Touchless Payments Working Committee is also concluding a white paper focusing on the expanded range of data elements available in digital transactions compared to legacy systems.

The <u>Payments Fraud Working Committee</u> published a <u>podcast</u> on the topic of Preparing for the Rise of Quantum Computing, in which our experts dive into how quantum computing changes everything about security, especially for payments.

The <u>Petroleum</u> Working Committee is continuing to draft a project on the topic of Guidance Regarding Unattended Debit, Credit, and Prepaid Pre-Auth Hold Releases, which aims to help improve the consistency and timeliness of release of pre-authorization holds.

The <u>Testing and Certification Working Committee</u> is working on an educational project on payment acceptance test automation and development principals as a way to help streamline the EMV contact and contactless testing and certification process.


The <u>Transit Open Payments Working Committee</u> completed a <u>webinar</u> entitled Expanding Transit Open Payments Use Cases Through Fare Programs aimed at boosting the adoption of contactless open payments in the transit industry, and is working on a project highlighting the key takeaways from the webinar. The working committee also welcomed new co-chair Michael Hyzer of American Express.

The Forum held its summer virtual member meeting on July 23rd & 24th and it was a busy and productive two-day event. Elspeth Bloodgood from Jack Henry<sup>™</sup> kicked off the meeting with a keynote address entitled Instant Payments at an Inflection Point and attendees listened in to hear how the adoption of instant payments is going, what case study findings are showing, and the opportunities before the industry. The Merchant Risk Council conducted a session on fraud trends within the card-not-presentspace, which featured panelists from U-Haul and Sony. The ever-evolving landscape of EV payments was also discussed with insights shared from EMVCo, Voyager, Giesecke+Devrient, and Discover. The Joint Merchant and Issuer Special Interest Group (SIG), one of the Forum's flagship sessions, was held on the first day and leads Keri Crane and Joe Vasterling expertly worked through a list of topics raised by attendees. With the close of the virtual meeting, the Forum is looking ahead to Newport, Rhode Island, the destination of our next in-person event in November.
